Definitions

- “Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year, and includes all the students who remained enrolled after their cancellation period.
- “Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On Time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On Time Completion Rate” is the number of on time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed within 150% of the program length (includes on time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates unavailable for employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain any salary information



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STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Should you cancel this enrollment agreement, you are eligible for a full refund, minus your \$50 non-refundable application fee, up to the first day of school, or the 7th day after you sign this agreement, whichever is later. The cancellation request must be submitted to the school's director in writing and approved. The School is required to issue the refund within 45 days of the request being accepted.

If you are requesting to withdraw from the program after it has started, or a withdrawal is caused by you violating conduct as per the handbook, you will be returned any unearned charges by receiving a prorated refund based on a calculated cost per day of your program, minus the \$50 fee, provided this withdrawal happens no later than 60% into your program. After 60% of the program is complete, tuition is considered "earned" and no refund is allowed.

For your program, the final date for a withdrawal-based refund is end of week 10 for full-time program and end of week 20 for part-time program.

Should you request a refund due to cancellation of this agreement or withdrawal from the program, you must submit the request in writing to the Director of the school and any refund requests will be replied to within seven business days.

Loans

If you obtain a loan to pay for this educational program, you have the responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund.

Should you default on a federal or state loan, both of the following may occur:

1. The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against you, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on a loan.
2. You may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government financial assistance until the loan is repaid.
